

## Christianity subverted - Tony Pearce



Recently the Pope travelled to Iraq. There, he stood up for Iraq's dwindling number of Christians, once quite a significant minority with numbers in the millions, now down to about 250 000 people who have mainly been driven out or killed by Islamic hostility.

His aim was to foster inter-religious dialogue. He met with Iraq's most revered Shiite leader (Ali Al-Sistani) and he urged Muslims and Christian religious leaders to put aside animosities to work together for peace and unity during an interfaith meeting at the traditional birthplace of Abraham, the father of their faiths.

He said: *"This is true religiosity to worship god to love our neighbour"*. He travelled to in Ur of the Chaldeans in Southern Iraq, the place where Abraham came from and he gave an address to reinforce his inter-religious tolerance and fraternity message during the first ever papal visit to Iraq. He said:

*"From this place where faith was born, from the land of our father Abraham, let us affirm that God is merciful and that the greatest blasphemy is to profane His Name by hating our brothers and sisters. Hostility, extremism and violence are not born of a religious heart, they are betrayals of religion."*

He spoke about the need for people of different faiths to be accepted and loved by one another. On one level, this is probably quite a good thing to say. I mean that the people in Iraq have suffered terribly, the Christians in Iraq have been driven out. To have somebody standing up for them is a good thing. Also, to urge people to be at peace with each other and not to fight each other, is a good idea as well.

But the problem with what the Pope is saying, and what he does by his actions is that he's saying that, actually, the reason why we should come together is because all our religions are the same; Christianity and Islam are both worshipping the same God, we're all part of the same equation, and there's no difference theologically between us.

So, let's come together and have a one-world religious system in which Muslims, Christians and everybody else embraces each other in this glorious one-world religious system.

That of course, is not good, because Christianity and Islam can't come together. Because Islam is actually anti-Christian, it denies that Jesus died on the cross, that He's the Messiah, that He's the saviour who died for our sins, that He's the Son of God.

It persecutes Christians in many countries of the world and there is a profound theological difference between what the Bible says and what the Quran says. So, any attempt to bring them together is actually bringing together two things which are opposite.

And the attempt to unite the world religions is something which is prophesied in the Bible, in **Revelation 17**, that world religions are brought together into a one world religious system.

Moreover, of course, the Pope doesn't represent real Christianity but the Roman Catholic perversion of it.

## Pope Francis' historic visit to Iraq

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- 1 5 March: Greeted by Iraqi Prime Minister **Mustafa al-Kadhimi** in Baghdad. Official ceremony at the Presidential Palace with Iraqi President **Barham Salih**.
  - 2 6 March: Meeting in Baghdad with Catholic priests and nuns in **Our Lady of Salvation Church** - at the site of the 2010 massacre by Al Qaeda-linked gunmen that killed 58 people.
  - 3 6 March: Meets with Iraq's top Shiite Muslim cleric **Ali al-Sistani**, in Najaf.
  - 4 6 March: Hosts interfaith meeting in Nasiriyah, at the ancient city of Ur, birthplace of **Abraham**.
  - 5 1 Returns to Baghdad to celebrate mass at **Chaldean Cathedral of Saint Joseph**.
  - 6 4 March: Meets representatives of autonomous region of Kurdistan in Erbil.
  - 7 5 In Mosul, the Pope will offer prayers at a memorial for the victims of conflict in Iraq.
  - 8 6 Visits largest Christian town in Iraq, Qaraqosh, where population fled the Islamic State groups arrival in 2014.
  - 9 4 Celebrates mass at **Fraso Hariri Stadium** in Erbil.
  - 10 8 March: Farewell ceremony at Baghdad airport.



He's also seeking union with the world government forces for a one-world religion. Here's another quote from the Pope. He spoke on the post-pandemic world in the same way as the 'Global Reset' people. He insisted that *'Things will never be the same in a post-pandemic world, calling instead for the establishment of a New World Order.'* And he had to use that phrase.

In a book entitled God and the world to come, the pontiff reiterates his case for the great reset with a shift away from financial speculation, fossil fuels, military buildup,

and towards a green economy based on inclusiveness. He says:

*"The world will never be the same again but it is precisely within this calamity that we must grasp those signs which may prove to be cornerstones of reconstruction."*

'Build back better', he's saying the same thing. He goes on:

*"Let's keep in mind that there is something worse than the crisis: the drama of wasting it. We cannot emerge from a crisis the same as before, we either come out better or we come out worse."*

It's saying almost exactly the same thing as the 'global reset' and the New World Order people are saying. He continues:

*"We can heal injustice by building a new world order based on solidarity, studying innovative methods to eradicate bullying, poverty, and corruption; all working together for their own part without delegating and passing the buck. The path to humanity's salvation passes through the creation of a new model of development which unquestionably focuses on coexistence among people in harmony with creation."*

Notice he says *'the path to humanity's salvation'*. Now the pope is supposed to be a Christian. I don't think he is. But if you're a Christian, what is the path to salvation? The path to salvation is through repentance and faith in Jesus Christ, and preaching the Gospel. He's saying it's through bringing everybody together in a one world vision, with a global religious and political system which unites people and actually denies the Christian uniqueness of Jesus saying **I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except by me.**

And if you follow through what he's saying, it's almost identical to what Klaus Schwab and the global reset people are saying: that we need to reset the world; a new world is going to emerge and it'll end up with some form of global governance in which we have this New World Order.

He's also going along with the UN plan and, just last month, the UN held what they called the International Day of Human Fraternity in the context of World Interfaith Harmony Week *'providing an opportunity to highlight the principles and values included in the document on 'Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together'*. An alliance of civilizations in partnership with the permanent missions of Egypt and the United Arab Emirates to the UN, as well as the highest Kaya Committee of Human Fraternity is organizing an event entitled A Pathway to the Future to celebrate this international day.

What that really means: He's saying *'We've got to get everybody together in a one-world religious system and a one-world political system'*. They're all singing from the same hymn sheet, and it all leads to **Revelation chapter 13**, not a 'good world system' but to a 'bad world system' under the Antichrist.
